We have been given much advice as to the method of finding and following this highway of the Spirit.

“If thine eye be single, thy whole body (whole being) shall be full of light.”

“Because thou hast made the Lord thy habitation, there shall no evil befall thee.”

We must give our complete attention and love to God, to the mighty living Spirit which fills heaven and earth. Until we look to God, our Creator---consciously live and move and have our being in this perfect Spirit the promise cannot be fulfilled.

We *are* affected by what we dwell upon in thought. Therefore, it behooves us to consider well where we are placing our attention.

So were the Hebrews led out of Egypt.

So are we led out of Egypt, out of the false concepts in the outer where our uneducated senses deceive us.

Guided by night and by day we travel nobly through our life's journey.

Traveling the highway of holiness means trusting God absolutely.

It means relaxing and letting the divine Plan unfold through us and for us.

WHAT PRICE ENLIGHTENMENT?

As a newly-appointed Director of a New Thought Study Group, many years ago, I received a letter from a young man living in a country town. The envelope was heavily stamped in bright red ink in many places: URGENT – URGENT – URGENT. Propelled by this sense of urgency, I quickly opened the letter to read: “Please can you sell me the secret of enlightenment? Please tell me how much it costs and please answer by return mail as I must be enlightened by next Wednesday night!”

Well, that was a very tall order for me in my new and unfamiliar role. By return mail I sent him an explanation of the Truth Principles and I added: “I am sorry that I cannot “sell” you the secret of enlightenment as you can find it *nowhere outside yourself*. If you turn inward in constant prayer, meditate, and commune with your indwelling God Presence; if you always place God first in your life; if you endeavor to live with integrity at all times, then your spiritual awareness will unfold and you will be enlightened from within. The truth is that you cannot find your God anywhere but within your own consciousness.”

I did not hear from that young man again and I must confess that I have often wondered, down through the years, just what was to happen on that “next Wednesday night”?

I still wonder “what is enlightenment”? When can one truly say, “I am enlightened”? When we graduate from worshipping an outer God and find all the joy and wonder of our own inner divinity – the indwelling Christ – can we consider ourselves enlightened when we unthinkingly pass judgment on another or even listen to prevailing gossip?

As we journey along our own unique spiritual path, we sometimes experience an enlightening breakthrough. The dust of everyday living clears momentarily from the windows of our consciousness and we catch a glimpse of the greater reality and we are surprised to find that it is our true state of being.

It may be a near-death experience that fills us with light and we emerge from the golden glow knowing with certainty that there is no death, just the shedding of the physical body, like taking off an old overcoat, and stepping out in our “spiritual body” into the glorious adventure of eternal life. Even with this new, wondrous, inner knowing, we still find ourselves being the same old personality making the same old mistakes.

Or perhaps, a meditational merging with all that Is; a breaking-down of the bodily boundaries to find that all is interconnected and interdependent – there can be no separation – our natural state is a golden oneness with the wholeness of being. An experience of such love and bliss that one must think: Surely, now I am enlightened.

However, again, our humanness takes over and we are back in the everyday world coping with mundane concerns.

So, perhaps, enlightenment is a series of ever-expanding aware-nesses which drop into our consciousness when we least expect them. They thrill us with new insights, but they cannot do God’s perfect work in us until we pay the price.

Yes, the young man was right after all. There is a price to be paid for enlightenment, the price of total surrender to God’s guidance--the still, small voice within. When we can truly say, “Not my will Lord, but thine be done”; when we turn inward and seek divine direction for our every thought, word, and action; then we drop our little self to find our larger Self. We are no longer outer-directed. We act only from the Infinitude of the indwelling God Presence. I think then, and only then, we are entitled to say, “I am enlightened”!

The Common Denominator

Do you remember that era when it was popular to say, “Day by day, in every way, I’m getting better and better?” There were those who made fun of the saying, for it seemed foolish to subscribe to such a policy when, in their own experience, day by day things seemed to be getting worse. This statement achieved popularity in a short time, however, because there were those who, upon recognizing the power of belief *with conviction*, found that things actually were getting better as they stayed with this idea.

Does this not reveal to us that it is not the mere speaking of the tongue, but rather, the speaking of the mind and the heart that is instrumental in bringing about healing? Let us examine the common denominator in this process of whole-making.

Spiritual healing is not some new innovation. In the Old Testament are many recorded instances of spiritual healing and miraculous supply --- in itself, a healing. For example, let us refer to the works of the prophet Elijah, who lived approximately nine hundred years before Jesus made his appearance on this earth.

Elijah was an uncouth, burly son of the desert. His startling aspects, his sudden appearances and disappearances made him a rather mysterious personage. Some believe that he had mastered the art of dematerialization. He was a prophet in an altogether different sense than any who had gone before him. He bears the distinction of being the first one since Moses to understand laws higher than those of this plane. Applying them, he performed many so-called miracles. Yet, I feel sure that in his estimation they were but the outcome of God’s right and perfect action and the belief in man’s own divinely inherited wholeness.

Because of political disturbances, Elijah, following the inner Voice, God speaking in man, went into the wilderness where ravens daily brought him bread and meat. Then, later on, he was led to go to a village where he had been assured that a widow, complying with God's instructions, would house and feed him. As he asked for drink and bread, the woman was quite distraught, for she had only a handful of flour and a cup of oil. Faced with starvation, she was preparing this last meal for her son and herself; but Elijah's firm request, which was, in effect, the calling forth of faith, she baked a loaf and gave it to the prophet.

Now here is the realization and proving of the law of giving and receiving. As a result of her giving, she found that there was always plenty of flour and oil to feed Elijah, her son, and herself until the rains came and the crops grew again.

Some time later, the widow's son became ill and died; but this man of understanding, with unwavering faith in the deathlessness of Spirit, took the boy to his room---the "entering into the closet"--- and the boy revived. The mother declared: "Truth you are a prophet. Whatever you say is from the Lord, and He works through you."

The same Christ Consciousness which, through Jesus, raised Lazarus from the dead, raised the widow's son from the dead almost nine hundred years earlier. This is further proof that whatever God does He does forever!

Other miraculous happenings concern Elijah's successor, Elisha, who was more gracious and gentler of manner than Elijah, although he, too, was totally uncompromising where the Truth was concerned. Elisha duplicated and surpassed the miracle of replenishing the oil. Through the faith of this prophet, so much oil was supplied for another widow woman that she was able to sell the oil, pay all of her debts, and have plenty to provide for herself and two sons.

There is no end to God's supply. His warehouse is inexhaustible. When are we really going to believe and accept the abundance that God offers us?

Later, Elisha took lodging in a house in which the wife had longed for a child to no avail. Recognizing the depth of her yearning, the prophet predicted she would bear a son despite the advanced age of her husband. She gave birth to a male child.

One day, as the son, now grown, was working in the fields with his father, he experienced severe head pains and soon died. Elisha was called, and in the tradition of his predecessor, he went into the room and shut the door---again the "entering into the closet," which Jesus later recommended. (We are told to shut out all appearances and distractions and to be still and know.") Then Elisha lay outstretched upon the child's body, his hands upon the child's hands, his eyes upon the child's eyes, his mouth upon the child's mouth, and he breathed

life back into him. He was a life-restoring channel for the one Infinite Intelligence.

There are some fifty-four accounts of what have been called miracles in the Old Testament, ranging from the sweeping back of the Red Sea and the burning bush that was not consumed, in the time of Moses, to the freeing of Jonah from the belly of the whale. The New Testament records thirty-five miraculous happenings through Jesus' expression of the Christ Consciousness, beginning with the water being changed into wine, and including the feeding of the five thousand with but five loaves and two fishes, all manner of physical healings, and the raising of the dead. The most meaningful miracles of all were his own Resurrection and Ascension. And he sent forth his faithful disciples with the instruction to "preach the Gospel and heal the sick."

The power of Truth is in no way lessened or weakened by the passing of time, for Truth is Reality that is eternal and changeless. Spiritual healing is taking place throughout the world now. Today we are aware of the beneficial results that have been accomplished and are being accomplished through the efforts of many dedicated persons. ... They do not believe that *they* do the healing; they will tell you that the omnipotent Power does the healing. Thus, they follow the example of Jesus, who rejected all personal glory and declared, "Not I; the Father that dwelleth in me, he doeth the works." ...

Ancient and modern accounts of miracles of healing bring us to ask: What is the common denominator of all spiritual healings? Modern-day healings occur wherever the Principle of Spiritual Healing is accepted and practiced. What is this Principle which is available to all, regardless of time or person or creed? We have been given the promise, "I will undo all that afflicts thee." I find my greatest assurance in the statement, "My Lord will perfect all that concerns me." Realize that these are conditional promises, as are all the scriptural promises; their realization depends upon something we must do, some conviction we must have.

The condition in all healing is,
According to your faith, your belief, be it done unto you.

Go to the Father within, the Source of all Life, and let the healing Power work through you.

Jesus brought forth the discovery that there is *at hand* a Kingdom of God. Millions of people have believed in the kingdom of God but almost invariably they have transported that kingdom from earth to another land, from the present life to a life beyond the grave.

Jesus employed all his talent, all his symbolism, all his spiritual force, to make man aware of the nature of the kingdom. He compared it to a grain of mustard seed, to a portion of yeast--to one thing after another; but as Emerson says it is impossible to reveal anything to another until due preparation has been made.

Jesus revealed to the world that there is this kingdom of God, invisible to the eye, but penetrating to every fibre and every cell of this great universe--a kingdom which may be drawn upon and used just as the great currents of electricity are drawn upon by those who understand them. The kingdom of heaven is not an occult thing nor a condition pertinent to another life.

Jesus Christ affirms that the power, the wisdom, the joy and the wealth of the kingdom lie centered in the “within” of every human being. He had no other source of power than the source of his own soul, his own oneness with God, The power of feeding the multitudes or of raising the dead was within himself, and he tells us that the same kingdom of God is within us.

That the kingdom was not a distant one was also revealed by Jesus, for he reached out and touched that kingdom again and again. A woman suffering an infirmity of years put her hand upon the hem of his garment and was restored to health. In this marvelous power was demonstrated the fact that he was indeed a citizen of the kingdom. His disciples follow his teachings and they likewise are filled with power. Sometimes their power becomes weak and the Master tells them it is because they have not remained (constant) in the realm of God but have stepped out of it by their fear or lack of faith.

There is a tendency in the human mind to limit the mercy and purpose of God; but Jesus saw that the kingdom of God is so infinitely great that it does not leave out a single soul. He said, “There shall be one fold and one shepherd.” The kingdom lies in every man.
